This Cookie Policy applies to the sending, writing, reading and use of cookies for our website with domain name www.conson.com (hereinafter referred to as "the Website"). The owner and webmaster of the website is Conson A/S (Møllevangen 22, 4220 Korsør - Denmark) with VAT nr. DK34882320, and by Conson Belgium - Cottyn & Partners bv (Jan Baptist De Greeflaan 12, 1731 Zellik - Belgium) with VAT nr. BE0446673122.

1. Information about our use of Cookies

Our website uses Cookies and similar technologies to distinguish your preferences from those of other users of our website. In this way we can make your user experience during a visit to our website as pleasant as possible and we can improve our website at the same time.

Cookies and similar technologies do not allow us to systematically collect data to identify visitors to our website. They only help us to improve how our website works, understand the interests of our users and measure the effectiveness of the content of our website.

As a result of recent legislative changes, all websites targeting certain parts of the European Union are required to ask for your consent to use or store cookies and similar technologies on your computer or mobile device. This cookie policy gives you clear and complete information about the cookies we use and their purpose.

2. What is a cookie?

A "cookie" is a small text file sent by a website server and stored on your computer's hard drive. In this way we remember your preferences during a visit to our website.

The information recorded by these cookies may only be read by the sender and only during the visit to the website. You can disable the use of these cookies by adjusting the settings of your web browser.

3. Types of cookies

Cookies can be divided according to their origin, function and durability.

First party cookies are cookies that are sent by the website that the user is visiting, i.e. the website whose address is in the address bar. (e.g. the cookies that Conson Belgium uses)

Third party cookies are cookies that are sent by a different domain than the one the user is visiting. A third party cookie is when a user visits a particular website and a third party sends a cookie via that website. (eg cookies that use Google, Twitter and Facebook).

Functional cookies are cookies that guarantee the proper functioning of the website. (eg cookies for login or registration data, language preferences). Functional cookies are logically first party cookies.

Non-functional cookies are cookies that can be placed for statistical, social, targeting or commercial purposes. They have no impact on the technical support of the website. Thanks to cookies with a statistical function, we know which pages of the website you are visiting, where your computer is located, etc. Cookies with a social function enable the user to share the content of the visited website directly with others via social media. Cookies with a targeting function help us to create a profile based on your surfing behavior so that the advertisements displayed are tailored to your interests. Cookies with a commercial purpose keep track of how many and which advertisements a user sees. Non-functional cookies can be both first party and third party cookies.

Permanent cookies are stored on the user's device between surfing sessions to remember preferences or actions of that user. The cookies are activated every time that the same user visits the website (e.g. cookies placed by social media such as Twitter, Facebook, Google Analytics, etc.). Most non-functional cookies are permanent cookies.

Session cookies allow websites to track the actions of a user during a browsing session. A surfing session starts from the moment a user opens his web browser and ends when he closes the window again. Session cookies are only placed temporarily. When you close the browser, the cookie will be deleted. Most functional cookies are session cookies.

4. Your consent

When you visit our website for the first time you will be asked to accept our various cookies. You can allow or reject the cookies for each category. You can change the cookie settings for our website at any time via a hyperlink at the bottom of our website and thus revise your consent.

5. Change your browser settings

We draw your attention to the fact that you can change your cookie settings in your browser. These settings can usually be found via the 'Options' or 'Preferences' menu of your web browser.
